

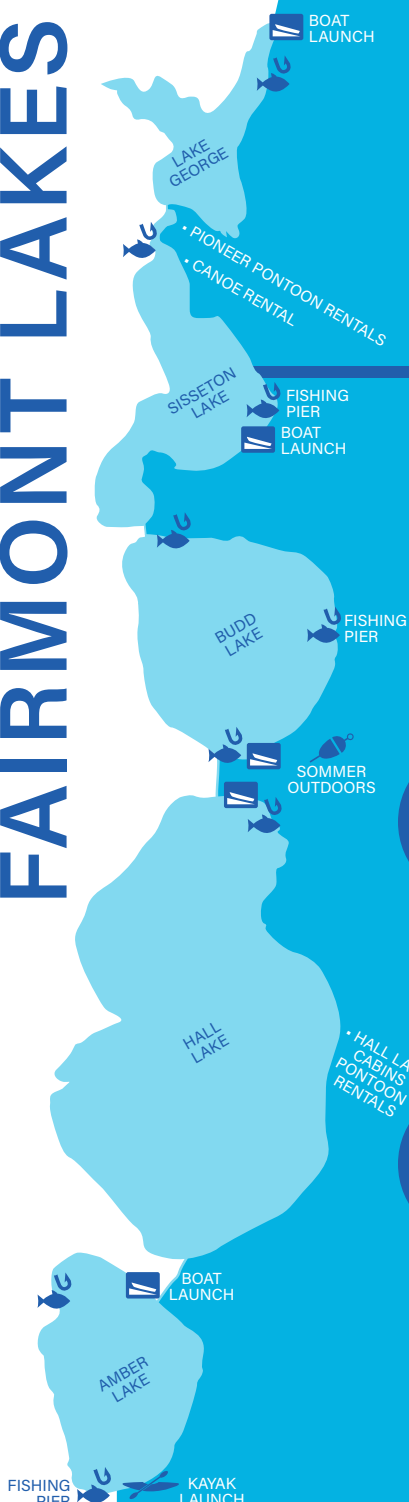

LAKE GEORGE

84 ACRES • 11 FEET DEEP

This shallow lake is considered a 'gem' by many because of its peaceful serenity. In 2014, the Fairmont Lakes Foundation (FLF) stocked this lake with 300 Bluegills, so you will find an ample supply of fish along with 7 public fishing locations.

FISH SPECIES: Black Bullhead, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Channel Catfish, Largemouth Bass, Muskie, Northern Pike, Orangespotted Sunfish, Walleye, White Crappie, Yellow Bullhead, Yellow Perch, Bigmouth Buffalo, Common Carp, Freshwater Drum, White Sucker, Johnny Darter, Golden Shiner, Spottail Shiner

SISSETON LAKE

140 ACRES • 19 FEET DEEP

Lake Sisseton's shoreline of rock, gravel, sand and woody debris provide good habitat for fish. A popular fishing lake, the DNR stocks this lake with Walleye fingerlings every other year. In 2014, the FLF stocked this lake with 300 Bluegills.

FISH SPECIES: Black Bullhead, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Channel Catfish, Green Sunfish, Largemouth Bass, Muskie, Northern Pike, Walleye, White Crappie, Yellow Bullhead, Yellow Perch, Bigmouth Buffalo, Common Carp, Freshwater Drum, Quillback, White Sucker, Bluntnose Minnow, Fathead Minnow, Golden Shiner, Johnny Darter, Shiners, Spottail Shiner

BUDD LAKE

224 ACRES • 23 FEET DEEP

Budd Lake is the middle of the Fairmont Chain of Lakes. Four solar powered aeration devices circulate the water from the surface down to a depth of approximately 6'. This circulation helps improve the oxygen levels in the water.

FISH SPECIES: Black Bullhead, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Channel Catfish, Green Sunfish, Largemouth Bass, Muskie, Northern Pike, Walleye, White Crappie, Yellow Bullhead, Yellow Perch, Bigmouth Buffalo, Common Carp, Freshwater Drum, Quillback, White Sucker, Fathead Minnow, Golden Shiner, Johnny Darter, Spottail Shiner, Spottail Shiner

HALL LAKE

513 ACRES • 27 FEET DEEP

Hall Lake is the largest and deepest of the chain of lakes. It is a great lake for waterskiing, as well as sailboats, jet skis, wind surfing, fishing and more. Gomsrud Park (between Hall & Budd) has the largest parking area and boat launch in the city.

FISH SPECIES: Black Bullhead, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Channel Catfish, Green Sunfish, Largemouth Bass, Muskie, Northern Pike, Walleye, White Crappie, Yellow Bullhead, Yellow Perch, Bigmouth Buffalo, Common Carp, Freshwater Drum, Quillback, Shorthead Redhorse, White Sucker, Fathead Minnow, Golden Shiner, Johnny Darter, Shiners, Spottail Shiner

AMBER LAKE

180 ACRES • 19 FEET DEEP

Amber Lake is the only lake whose channel does not allow watercraft to pass through to other lakes in the chain. In 2014, the DNR stocked this lake with Walleye fingerlings and the FLF stocked it with 400 Bluegills.

FISH SPECIES: Black Bullhead, Black Crappie, Bluegill, Channel Catfish, Green Sunfish, Largemouth Bass, Muskie, Northern Pike, Orangespotted Sunfish, Walleye, White Crappie, Yellow Bullhead, Yellow Perch, Bigmouth Buffalo, Common Carp, Freshwater Drum, Quillback, White Sucker, Emerald Shiner, Fathead Minnow, Golden Shiner, Johnny Darter, Spottail Shiner
